Who is the MPA?

- The Music Publishers Association (MPA) is a trade body that represents music publishers and is recognised as the unified voice of UK music publishing
- . The MPA has over 165 members across every genre of music.
- On behalf of its members the MPA acts as a collective voice for all UK Music Publishers including lobbying government on topics such as AI and Music Education.
- It also offers training courses and networking events for members such as the MPA
 Christmas Lunch

Music Publishing is concerned with developing, protecting and valuing music.

- The role of a music publisher involves:
- Finding new and talented songwriters and composers, and encouraging and supporting them as they develop their skills,
 providing them with the facilities they need to produce music or offering advice and guidance in writing for particular markets.
- Securing commissions for new works
- Registering the works of songwriters and composers with all appropriate collecting societies and agencies, eg PRS for Music in the UK
- Producing and licensing the production of printed music
- Producing promotional materials
- Promoting composers and songwriters and their music to performers, broadcasters, record companies and others who use music on a commercial basis, both nationally and internationally
- Licensing the use of music, whether directly in the case of individual and special usages (eg synchronisation deals) or via the collecting society network
- Responding to new licensing opportunities that flow from technological developments
- · Monitoring and tracking the use of the music they represent and ensuring that proper payment is made for all licensed uses
- · Making royalty payments to songwriters and composers in respect of the usage of their music
- Taking appropriate action against anyone using music without the necessary licence



Who is PMLL?

- Printed Music Licensing Ltd. (PMLL) is a non-profit organisation and is owned by the Music Publishers Association (MPA) and is part of the MPA Group of companies.
- PMLL issues licences on behalf of their rights-holders. These licences permit the reproduction of printed music in many different sectors.
- The licence fees paid to PMLL are distributed to their publisher members.
- . With over 130 publisher members, PMLL issue a number of licensing schemes:
 - Amateur Group Singing Licence (AGSL) (for Amateur Choirs and Amateur Theatre Groups)
 - Schools Printed Music Licence (SPML)
 - Music Service Licence (MSL)
 - o Higher Education Printed Music Licence (HEPML)

AMATEUR CHOIR LICENCE



A simple licensing solution to allow choirs to legally photocopy sheet music whilst ensuring songwriters and composers are fairly paid for the use of their works.

- Legally allows the photocopying of sheet music without seeking individual publisher's permission (original copy of the music must be owned)
- Allows minor arrangements (e.g. Change of key to suit the voices of the choir)*.



^{*}more substantial arrangements will need direct publisher permission

Cost of the Licence*

- · £2.50 per choir member for up to 5 works
- · £5.00 per choir member for up to 10 works
- £10.00 per choir member for up to 25 works
- £15.00 per choir member for up to 50 works

Reports

A condition of the licence is that choirs report what works have been copied.

PMLL Portal


The portal has a data submission page which makes it quick and simple to submit information on what you have used.

Why do we need data?

Money that PMLL collects via licence fees is then paid onto publishers who onward pay the writers and composers of the works copied.

Background and Context to NPALS

- Significant local authority budget pressures in 2015 impacting on libraries. Music Library as a non-statutory and charged for services under scrutiny
- Commitment to developing a long- term sustainable service for Nottinghamshire, Leicestershire and Rutland
- Opportunity to improve the existing service but...need to to establish a financially viable service – reduce costs /creative efficiencies and generate income
- Strong leadership & vision and a project team committed to service improvement and change and....protection of music and arts in the community
- Innovative Service Offer as a result of extensive research and consultation over a period of 12 months
- New Service successfully launched January 2016



Key elements of Service

- Built from scratch music and drama catalogues using expert volunteers
- A music stock of over 3,500 titles (87,000 copies) Amalgamation of Leicester and Nottingham stock
- Bespoke IT system giving 24/7 online access to view catalogues and make bookings
- "Pay as you go" cost: per copy per month
- Groups able to reserve sets up to 1 year in advance
- Specialist staff knowledge and expertise available: phone/email/visit
- Groups access their account online and see items on loan/returned and progress of any orders/requests/payments/ILL
- Delivery collection at site, local Nottinghamshire Library or courier service




Successes since Launch

- Effective cross-county working to develop a regional service and solution
- First authority to develop a bespoke IT system and catalogue for managing the service
- Hearts for the Arts local authority award winner 2017 and IAML awards in 2019
- Weathered the storm of the impact of the pandemic
- Partnerships contracts with NewSPAL (Surrey's Performing Arts Library Service) and Hertfordshire County Council in 2020 and 2023 respectively for the Licencing and hosting of the IT system
- Currently 380 registered user groups with the service
- Service now avaiable to groups nationally

The library includes music and archive collections from:

- Violinists and orchestra leaders including Anton, Monia Liter, Tom Jenkins Max Jaffa and Alfred Reynolds
- Light music composer, Ernest Tomlinson, the initiator of this vast collection
- Manuscript music from the London Palladium, West End shows, TV productions, and many more
- Many sets of music previously lost to publishing houses, public libraries and collections.
- A treasure trove of lesser-known works and underrepresented composers.
 So far, our research has found more than one hundred female composers, and these are listed separately on our website.

Library charges

We charge members an administration fee for use of the music for a period of up to three months.

Additional charges (£12 per extra month per set)
